

Spanish Language Fix it Fair: an opportunity to create equitable spaces and ownership



Background

In 2016, the City of Eugene transitioned ongoing Sustainable Consumption work focusing on the circular economy into a robust repair and reuse program that provides ongoing education and events to the community for the purposes of preventing waste and promoting repair; helping keep money in our local economy and supporting families in our area. This work began as an effort to assess the capacity of repair events to shift consumer attitudes and drive expansion of repair activities and fully test them for their potential impact.

Many US cities are experimenting with the repair events as an event format to engage residents in repairing household goods and equipment. These events can help residents reduce discards, extend the useful life of household goods and drive more repair activities. Repairing broken items gives community members more options beyond throwing goods away and repair education is empowering and supports community resilience. As part of these efforts, the City regularly hosts <u>Fix-It Fairs</u>, inviting the community to get items repaired at no cost.

In concert with ongoing Fix-it Fairs, in 2019 the City's Waste Prevention program began hosting Fix-it Workshops: smaller more hands -on opportunities for community members to more intensively learn to repair items in more specific categories while working alongside experienced repair people. The City has also begun hosting some of the popular Fix-it Fair events entirely in Spanish to better serve Latinx community members and more effectively engage an underrepresented population around issues of waste prevention. As with all Fix-it Fairs the events include repair services and DIY repair education information for a variety of products, such as lawnmowers, appliances, furniture, electronics, clothing, and tools.

The most recent Spanish language Fix it Fair was staffed exclusively by Spanish speaking repair professionals and volunteers. Family friendly children's craft activities, games, and entertainment were also provided in Spanish. Additionally, the event project lead was recruited through the City's Language and Cultural Liaison (LCL) program which trains temporary City employees who bring language and cultural skills to the organization in order to help provide improved access to City services for communities that experience barriers.



Goals

The Spanish language version of our ongoing Fix-it repair education for the community connects the City of Eugene's triple bottom line informed provision of repair, resiliency and waste prevention resources for the community with organizational strategies and values intended to support all the residents that we serve. Free repair education and services have been offered to the community at large. By empowering and encouraging Eugene's Spanish speaking community to create and participate in a repair event, we hope to support a safe, welcoming environment for Latinx residents which reflects their own cultural attitudes, beliefs and practices.

One goal of these events is to offer not only free repair opportunities and education but also highlight repair businesses (including those that are Latinx owned) and connect them with more opportunities to potentially grow their business. Fixers are paid to participate in these event and encouraged to market their own businesses to attendees.

Spanish language Fix-it Fair event planning involved Latinx stakeholders, technical experts, and community groups such as <u>Huerto de Familia</u>, <u>La-e-Kiss</u>, and <u>IZO Marketing</u> in order to receive and pay market rate for guidance around how to deliver the event in such a way that it is owned by the Spanish speaking community it is meant to serve. Contracting for vendor services such as event production, marketing, food services, music, and children's activities were intentionally provided by businesses or organizations that are owned by local Latinx people.

Another goal of the Spanish language Fix -it Fairs is to ensure impacted and vulnerable communities' individual and cultural needs are met by building relationships within this group of residents as part of this project, which moving forward, may help us as an organization perform the critical task of determining what types of actions have value to this community and get input on what types of education or services we offer in the future.

As noted in the background section, a critical role in delivering this project was performed by a member of the City's Language and Cultural Liaison Program (LCL) which is part of the City of Eugene's overall Language Access efforts, a central strategy of our organization's Equity & Human Rights Plan. LCL is a training program for temporary City employees who bring language and cultural skills to the organization, and the program's goals are to help provide improved language and cultural access to City services and engage communities that currently experience language and/or cultural barriers, while also investing in the skills of the City's workforce—creating access for and outreach within Spanish speaking and Latino communities. The LCL role was critical to the success of this project, and in turn this liaison received job experience, mentorship and networking support intended to prepare applicants to competitively apply for full-time, benefited employment with the City.



Moving Forward

Ongoing City sponsored digital versions of the Fix-it Fairs and Fix-it workshops continue safely in 2020 through a partnership with The <u>ToolBox Project</u>, a tool lending library that serves the Eugene and Springfield area. This new digital format increases the accessibility of Fix it events allowing community members to participate from home. The digital repair videos will also be available on the City's webpages providing on demand access to repair education for residents that cannot attend the events in real time.

Pivoting to a virtual format also moves forward efforts to connect with and support repair education for Spanish speaking community members as the City of Eugene plans the 2020 Spanish language Fix it Fair. This event is taking shape as a series of Spanish language digital repair videos which are free to attend. Each repair video in the series will be followed up with live Q&A sessions hosted by professional Fixers who will offer repair advice and coaching to attendees. Building on the successes from the previous Spanish language Fix it Fair, this digital format will also provide enhanced opportunities for participating Fixers to highlight their repair skills and business in front of an audience and to connect with future customers and grow their business.

The City intends to make free repair and reuse resources and education accessible to all. Our vision for the future of this work is to continue to develop the capacity of the repair sector in our area and foster community resilience by empowering and educating residents, and by investing in local Fixers by identifying and removing impediments to the growth of small repair businesses.

Innovation does not happen without new strategies and tools. Delivering these repair events in a way that ensures that the events are owned by the community they are meant to serve requires a certain amount of risk, flexibility and the ability to navigate obstacles while staying on course. As we continue this work through 2020 and into 2021, we will continue to learn from each event and workshop and adjust how we deliver repair programming based on feedback from resident stakeholders and continue to be guided by an organizational commitment to achieving a more resilient and equitable community.
